Notes for discussion: Saint Paul says Jesus will keep us without sin until the last day. Ask the students to offer their views as to what that might mean.

- (C) Jeremiah 33:14-16 (God's promise fulfilled)
Thessalonians 3:12-4:2 (Christ will strengthen us.)

Notes for discussion: Ask the students if the kind of love Saint Paul is talking about is something they can have in their own lives.

- (B) Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 (Prepare the way of the Lord.)
2 Peter 3:8-14 (New Heavens, new earth)
Mark 1:4-8 (John the Baptist)
Notes for discussion: Knowing what the word "baptize" means, ask the students what "baptizing with the Holy Spirit" could possibly mean.

- (C) Baruch 5:1-9 (The new Jerusalem)
Philippians 1:3-4,8-11 (The day of Christ)
Luke: 3:1-4 (John the Baptist)
Notes for discussion: You may wish to read Isaiah 40 with the students, which is quoted in Luke's Gospel.

John 14:1-12 (I am the Way.)

1 John 3:18-24 (Love one another.)

John 14:15-21 (The promise of the Spirit)
Notes for discussion: So that the disciples (us) would not be alone after he returns to the Father, Jesus promises to ask the Father to send the Holy Spirit. Ask why Jesus calls the Spirit the "Spirit of Truth."

Notes for discussion: Help the students see what is so radical about Jesus' idea of love.
